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## INTRODUCTION

The number of people living with HIV/AIDS continues to increase in Canada, and Aboriginal people are contracting the virus at alarming rates. Inuit living with HIV/AIDS in northern communities must travel south for treatment. This project developed out of concerns that there is a growing number of Inuit who live in urban areas who need, or are struggling to access, available prevention, testing, diagnosis, care, treatment, and support services.

Pauktuutit conducted a Needs Assessment titled *Ajjigijaunn gittuq: Addressing the HIV Needs of Inuit in Urban Centres*, which surveyed Inuit and front-line workers in urban areas. Urban Inuit stated that they needed more Inuit-specific resources and front-line workers said they needed more information about Inuit.

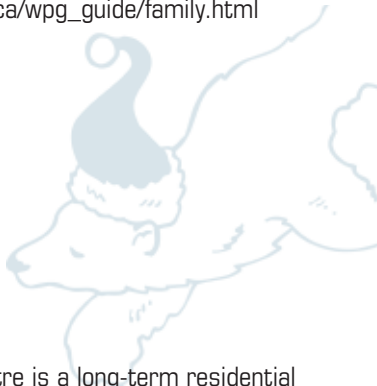
